It was installed in late September and is working perfectly. The phone app is very user-friendly and keeps my indoor temperature within a three degree range.

Since Innovative Mechanical is a Peninsula Clean Energy (PCE) approved HVAC contractor, I qualified for a \$10,000, 5-year, interest-free PCE loan. PCE also offers a \$1,500 rebate. In addition, I was told I qualified for a "measured rebate" (details at tinyurl.com/y87a2u8b) of \$3,259 which I am still waiting to receive. I'm skeptical. In April, I will qualify for a \$2,000 Federal tax credit.

So far, my experience with Innovative Mechanical has been good, my heat pump is meeting my needs, and my financial incentives are in progress. However, I recommend that you do your own research on HVAC contractors, heat pump systems, and incentives. If your research yields a better outcome, please let me know at steve@burlingamehills.org.

In late September, a home on the 100 block of Alturas Drive was burglarized. Although your Community Association Safety Committee contacted many neighbors regarding this particular burglary, we have yet to receive additional details.

Interestingly, the majority of burglaries have occurred at homes that are not subscribed to Burlingame Hills Urgent Announcements. This may be attributed to subscribers who tend to be more acquainted with their neighbors. This leads to more awareness of suspicious activity and increased reporting of suspicious activity on Nextdoor Burlingame Hills.

Subscribers may also have put in place precautions that are enumerated in past Burlingame Hills Urgent Announcements, such as installing cameras and alarm systems, and turning on alarm systems when leaving home.
